A Brief History

Valley City was founded in 1872 with the arrival of the Northern Pacific Railroad, initially called the Second Crossing of the Sheyenne. After early challenges in establishing a town, the railroad platted a site in 1878, and a popular vote renamed it Valley City. The first Dakota Boom (1879–1886) brought rapid growth, with the population reaching 2,000 by 1883. Milestones like the founding of the State Normal School (now Valley City State University) in 1890 and the arrival of the Soo Line in 1891 cemented the city's role as a regional center. The second Dakota Boom (1898–1917) saw a surge of European immigrants, nearly doubling the population by 1912. Valley City's growth peaked in the 1930s, followed by a post-WWII boost and development along I-94 in the 1950s. Despite economic shifts in the 1970s, Valley City's determination and innovation, including the formation of a development corporation in 1987, have kept it a thriving and lively community.

Today, Valley City is a vibrant destination where history, community spirit, and outdoor adventure come together. From its iconic Hi-Line Bridge to scenic trails and welcoming downtown, this small town with big potential offers something for everyone. Unique to Our Region

NORTHERN LIGHTS

The Northern Lights, also known as Aurora Borealis, are a breathtaking natural phenomenon often visible in North Dakota's clear, dark skies, especially during the fall and winter months. The state's low light pollution and expansive rural landscapes make it an ideal spot to witness the dancing hues of green, purple, and pink.

SUNFLOWER FIELDS

North Dakota is known for its stunning sunflower fields, especially during late summer when vast stretches of golden blooms cover the landscape. As one of the top sunflower-producing states in the U.S., these fields are not only a beautiful sight but also play a key role in agriculture, with sunflowers grown for seeds, oil production, and bird feed. North Dakota Tourism's website features an interactive sunflower field map with progress on blooming and field locations to find each field.

STUNNING SUNSETS

North Dakota's sunsets are truly unmatched, painting the sky with vibrant colors as the sun sets over vast, open landscapes. The wide horizons and clear skies create a perfect backdrop for breathtaking views that change with each passing moment.

MIDWESTERN CUISINE

North Dakota's exclusive cuisine reflects its rich cultural heritage, blending Scandinavian and German-Russian influences with locally sourced ingredients. Tater Tot Hotdish, a comforting casserole of ground beef, vegetables, and crispy tater tots, is a beloved family dish. Lefse, a traditional Norwegian flatbread made from mashed potatoes, is often served with butter and sugar, while Knoephla Soup, a creamy dish with dumplings, potatoes, and chicken broth, provides warmth during the state's cold winters. For those adventurous in taste, Lutefisk—dried fish rehydrated with lye—is a unique delicacy traditionally enjoyed during the holiday season.

Lake Ashtabula

Located 12 miles northwest of Valley City in one of the most scenic river valleys in the region, Lake Ashtabula offers visitors a wide range of recreation opportunities for every season of the year. Fishing and snowmobiling are available in the winter, while the spring and fall bring a beautiful view of the migrating waterfowl. Summertime offers an array of activities such as fishing, boating, camping, swimming, and picnicking.

Lake Ashtabula has three designated swimming areas, several lake-front dining options, and seven boat launching ramps maintained to provide boaters and fishermen access to all areas of the lake. All campsites have access to clean drinking water, restrooms, and most are equipped with playgrounds and picnic facilities. The Corps of Engineers operate seven recreation areas around Lake Ashtabula, providing a variety of facilities and services. They also actively manage 14 separate wildlife areas on the lake which provide quality habitat for many wildlife species. The North Country Trail also runs along the lake for those looking for a hiking adventure.

Valley City is one of the best places to fish in the state. With an abundance of large and small lakes and the winding river, you can find the perfect fishing spot. Lake Ashtabula, 12 miles north of Valley City, is a 5,100 acre lake abundant with walleye, northern pike, small mouth bass, white bass, yellow perch, muskie, and crappie. This fishing gold mine features fishing/ice fishing tournaments throughout the year including the Walleye Derby in June. The Sheyenne River also boasts great fishing including catfish, walleye, small-mouth bass, and the occasional muskie. Other locations for great summer fishing include Moon Lake, Fox Lake, and Monson Slough. Looking for an ideal ice fishing spot? Check out Lake Ashtabula, Island Lake, Eckelson Lake, Key Lake, and Hobart Lake.

Situated in the middle of the Central Flyway and on the east edge of the Prairie Pothole Region, North Dakota stands out as a prime destination for hunting migratory birds, waterfowl, pheasants, deer, and predators. Several public lands near Valley City, such as Waterfowl Production Areas and PLOTS lands, feature pockets of water and dry fields for hunting. This concealed treasure of hunting terrain promises rewarding experiences, inviting hunters to test their skills amidst the scenic landscapes of the Sheyenne River Valley. Everyone from avid hunters to beginners flock to Valley City to cross off that once-in-a-lifetme hunting trip from their bucket list. 

STARGAZING

The outskirts of Valley City are the perfect place to catch the constellations and even the Northern Lights. Find a place in the countryside with little light pollution to see an even more vibrant show of stars!

SNOWMOBILING

The Sheyenne Valley Trail is located south of Valley City. There is a wide variety of riding including a trail that follows the Sheyenne River bottom and the James River. It also has ditch riding, shelter belts, and wide open fields. This takes you through the Fort Ransom State Park and Little Yellowstone. Several other stops are located along the way for you to warm up or relax as you enjoy North Dakota's longest snowmobile trail.

CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING

Enjoy a day cross-country skiing on groomed trails at Eggerts Landing north of Valley City and Chautauqua Park (weather permitting).

KAYAKING 🔕

HIKING 🆄

Valley City is lucky to have not only a scenic byway and a water trail, but also the North Country Trail! Listed as the longest route in the National Trails System, the North Country Trail stretches from North Dakota to Vermont through national forests, rolling hills, charming communities, wide open prairies, and more. The NCT also cuts right through Medicine Wheel Park and Central Avenue making Valley City a central location for this activity! Look for the small blue markings!

PHOTOGRAPHY

BIRDING

Valley City is located in the Central Flyway, which is like an interstate for migrating waterfowl making their way to and from breeding grounds in the spring and fall. Many simply stay put when reaching the many lakes and rivers of this area. Four distinct seasons and many different habitats attract other smaller and sometimes rare species, making for the perfect place to see some pretty amazing birds on your stay in Barnes County!

Learn Something New

BARNES COUNTY MUSEUM

Founded in 1930, the Barnes County Museum is a treasure trove of history, open year-round to provide visitors with an ever-evolving experience of discovery and learning. Explore captivating exhibits such as Gundy the Triceratops, a 65-million-year-old fossil, and a scale model of the Hi-Line Bridge.

Uncover stories of early pioneer life, local military history, and the region's agricultural heritage through authentic artifacts and displays. Guided group tours offer a more personalized, in-depth look into Valley City's rich history. Notably, Valley City has been designated an American World War II Heritage City by the National Park Service (NPS), honoring the community's historic contributions to national security and humanitarian efforts during the war.

PLANETARIUM

Valley City State University is home to the only Planetarium in North Dakota. The state-of-theart Rhoades Science Center houses a Spitz 512 planetarium with a 24-foot domed ceiling and 50 reclining seats. Catch a show on one of the scheduled presentations or schedule a group show through VCSU. Visit valleycitycalendar.com for public show dates and topics.

ROSEBUD VISITOR CENTER

Take a look at the authentic Rosebud Superintendent's rail car that is housed in the Rosebud Visitor Center. Learn about what it was like traveling by train, and view real artifacts from the height of train travel. It also features history on the development of the Valley and the North Dakota Agriculture Hall of Fame.


BRIDGES TOUR

🛞 THE NORTH COUNTRY TRAIL

The North Country Trail (NCT) is the longest National Scenic Trail in the national trails system. With over 4,800 miles through different landscapes including grasslands, farms, forests, and communities, the trail runs through eight states including Vermont, New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, and North Dakota. The NCT runs right through the heart of Valley City and goes north to Lake Ashtabula and south to Kathryn.

The Trail meanders through the Sheyenne Valley across rolling hills, forest, prairie and through Valley City. Amenities along the Trail include backcountry campsites, campgrounds, public recreation areas, tourist information sites and supply stores. The Trail also crosses a number of natural, historic and cultural attractions. Certified segments include the Sheyenne State Forest, Fort Ransom State Park, Kathryn to Clausen Springs Recreation Area, Valley City and Lake Ashtabula.

WALKING PATHS IN VALLEY CITY

Valley City is a haven for walkers, offering a mix of concrete and asphalt sidewalks alongside beautifully groomed trails and paths. Take a stroll on the "Jefferson Mile," a scenic 1-mile paved loop that winds around Jefferson Elementary, Hi-Line Fields, Charlie Brown Field, Dacotah Bank Track/Hanna Field, and the Hi-Line Prairie Garden & Orchard. Adventure seekers will love that the North Country Trail runs directly through Valley City, passing through Medicine Wheel Park, up Central Avenue, and out toward Lake Ashtabula. Whether you're stretching your legs or enjoying a walk with your furry friend, Valley City is the perfect place to get moving!

SCENIC BYWAY


The Sheyenne River Valley National Scenic Byway stretches 63 miles along the breathtaking Sheyenne River Valley, from Baldhill Dam to Lisbon, following ancient Native American foot paths and pioneer wagon trails.

Tree-lined, rolling hills are dotted by quaint towns and farmsteads, lending to its Americana charm. In addition to nature and scenery at its best, archaeology, history, culture, and recreation are all found along this byway - North Dakota's first nationally recognized scenic byway.

Along the way you will find Little Yellowstone Park, two log cabins, sunflower fields, and 40 award winning interpretive panels.

Midwest Living magazine suggests this roadway as a "Fall Color Drive" and the route was also listed in National Geographic's Guide to Scenic Highways and Byways.

The Sheyenne River Water Trail offers an unforgettable outdoor adventure, providing enhanced recreation access while showcasing the natural beauty of the area. Stretching over 199 scenic river miles, this water trail invites paddlers of all skill levels to explore the peaceful, winding bends of the Sheyenne River through Valley City, Fort Ransom, Lisbon, and the National Grasslands. With both primitive and developed launch points, the trail offers a perfect blend of rustic charm and accessibility. Currently in development with improved signage, landings, and facilities, the Sheyenne River Water Trail is pursuing National Water Trail designation, making it the first National Water Trail in North Dakota - a destination for outdoor enthusiasts across the region.

Mark your calendar for the biggest river event of the year—Sheyenne RiverFest on August 2, 2025! Join over 200 paddlers as you launch from the National Fish Hatchery and float by rolling fields and wildlife, ending at Chautauqua Park where the celebration continues. Enjoy a vibrant craft and vendor show, delicious food trucks, and plenty of family fun. Don't miss this unforgettable summer tradition on the Sheyenne!

Valley City State University has been named one of the top public regional colleges in the Midwest and one of America's "Best Colleges" for 27 consecutive years by U.S. News. Founded in 1890, VCSU offers more than 65 undergraduate programs including outstanding reputations in education, fisheries and wildlife science, business, and more.

Valley City State University holds the title for the best elementary education program in the country, outranking non-profit public and private schools. Founded as a teacher's college, VCSU has held fast to its heritage and maintains an outstanding reputation for developing some of the finest K - 12 educators in the region.

Valley City State's 55-acre campus is bordered on the south by a forested hillside and on the north by the Sheyenne River. Medicine Wheel Park


This unique 30-acre park on the campus of Valley City State University began as a student project which soon expanded beyond the classroom walls to become a major tourist attraction and recreational site with picnic areas and beautiful flowers and plants.

Established in 1992 by Dr. Joe Stickler at Medicine Wheel Park, is a replica of a Native American solar calendar modeled after the Bighorn Medicine Wheel in Wyoming.

For many years, structures like this were referred to as "Turtle Effigies" due to their east-west orientation, with the head pointing east. This design was rooted in the belief that the world rested on the back of a giant turtle, forever crawling eastward. However, it wasn't until 1972 that archeoastronomers studying the Bighorn Medicine Wheel identified precise astronomical alignments marked in stone, coinciding with the rising sun on the Summer Solstice.

Medicine Wheel

A large circle measuring 213 feet around; the 28 spokes represent the number of days in the lunar cycle. Six spokes extending beyond the Wheel are aligned to the horizon positions of sunrises and sunsets on the first days of the four seasons.



IN THE PARK:

Walking Tour of the Solar System

The model of the solar system is represented with different sized boulders placed in proportion to the planets' average distances from the sun. 1 ft = 3 million miles

Native American Burial Grounds

There are 12 burial mounds within the borders of the park. They are the same type of cemeteries used by Plains Woodlands Indians from 500 to 2,000 years ago.

Meridian Calendar

The meridian calendar uses the length of a shadow cast by utility poles to mark the beginning of each season.

North Country National Scenic Trail

A segment of the North Country Trail runs through Medicine Wheel Park.

Jamestown, ND

Visit our wonderful neighbors to the West! Jamestown has tons of great places to eat, play, and stay on your trip around North Dakota!

World's Largest Buffalo

Standing at 26 feet tall and weighing 60 tons, the World's Largest Buffalo Monument is one of the Midwest's most popular roadside attractions. See live buffalo and visit the Frontier Village to uncover the secrets and rich history of the Jamestown area. Built in 1959, this monument has caught the eye of travelers as it can be seen from I-94. The Buffalo's name christened in 2010, is Dakota Thunder, picked from a contest held the same year. Fun fact - Dakota Thunder weighs about as much as five average-sized African Elephants, or 30 average-sized automobiles!

Kite Fest

Contests for the kids, kite making, concessions, inflatable air games, demonstrations, door prizes, and music fill the weekend. The festival takes place at Meidinger Park Field (10th St. & 17th Ave. SW).

Biking and Hiking Trails

With over 25 miles of trails to explore, Jamestown is one of the best places for hiking and bikings - and we're positive your K9 companions will love it! Traverse scenic views and varied terrain on paved, unpaved, short, long, easy, or challenging trails. For simple easy walks, many parks within Jamestown feature walking trails as well.

Birding

Like Valley City, Jamestown and the surrounding areas also feature 300+ species of birds to view right in the middle of the Central Flyway and the Prairie Potholes Region. Take the driving trails and see a handful of these birds including the Ferruginous Hawk, Sprague's Pipit, and Gray Partridge.

Hungry Pelican Lake Ashtabula

At not one, but two locations on Lake Ashtabula (the Dam and the Crossing), the Hungry Pelican is your ultimate destination for lake fun. From boat, kayak, paddleboard, and canoe rentals to delicious treats and drinks (including the signature "pelican poop" adult beverage), it's the perfect spot to soak up the weather all year. Keep an eye out for their thrilling events, featuring live bands, artists, volleyball tournaments, and much more!

Oscar-Zero Missile Alert Facility Cooperstown, ND

This preserved Minuteman III Missile Alert Facility located in Cooperstown, ND, was activated in 1966 during the Cold War and staffed 24 hours a day until 1996. The site features the above ground blast doors, a missile silo, the original control room, and more. The site has been transfered to the State Historical Society of North Dakota and is open to the public for individual and group tours where you can visit the facility as it would've looked back then as well as travel into the underground launch control center! For any level of history buff - this is a must see!

Thrill Hills

Fort Ransom, ND

Thrill Hills is a snow tubing facility that is fun for the whole family. With concessions and a liquor license, you can get a bite to eat, a drink, and spend the day tubing down the old "bunny hill" at the ski resort. With the new addition of skiing and snowboarding, Thrill Hills is a destination that you have to see. Keep up to date with Thrill Hills on their Facebook page to view updates on hours and hill conditions!



Fort Ransom State Park Fort Ransom, ND

Taking its name from a 1860s military fort, Fort Ransom State Park is located in the midst of the scenic and heavily wooded Sheyenne River Valley. The river provides abundant opportunities for canoeing, fishing and bird watching, while within the park can be found a short segment of the North Country National Scenic Trail. During the summer, horseback riding and camping are favorite activities, while cross-country skiing is a popular winter sport. A farmstead within the park is the setting for the annual Sodbuster Days celebration with demonstrations and exhibits of homesteading life. Fort Ransom State Park offers many amenities and activities for everyone. Featuring a campground and tenting, travelers can also rent luxurious yurts that are available for rent with running water, electricity, and a full kitchen.

Little Yellowstone

Kathryn, ND

Little Yellowstone Park is a 27 acre campground and recreational area. As a rest stop along the Sheyenne River Valley National Scenic Byway, this recreational area offers stunning hiking along a small stream and is the perfect destination for any outdoor enthusiast. Plan a weekend getaway by staying at the campground or just stop for a hike and a picnic for the day. Little Yellowstone is the picturesque location you've been looking for.

Sodbuster Days

Fort Ransom, ND

Sodbuster Days is held each year at Fort Ransom State Park and will transport you back in time. Sodbuster Days is an event unlike any other with events including a parade, horse-powered threshing, haying demo, interdenominational church service, and wheelwright demos. Enjoy live old-time music. Food and beverages will be available for purchase during the event including lefse.

Clausen Springs Kathryn, ND

Clausen Springs Park in North Dakota offers a peaceful getaway with 21 campsites (including reservable options) and three secluded non-electrical sites. Amenities include a playground, hiking trails, a horseshoe pit, a dock with a kayak launch, potable water, a dump station, pit toilets, a shower house, firewood for sale, and reservable picnic shelters, making it perfect for camping and outdoor gatherings.

Cottonwood Cider House Ayr, ND

ND's first Cidery, Cottonwood Cider House crafts its cider from apples grown by Cottonwood Farm. Located by Ayr, ND, Cottonwood Farm is a fourth generation family-owned farm and ND's largest commercial organic mixed fruit orchard. Apple trees grow alongside alfalfa, native prairie flowers and grasses, dandelions, bees, and birds.

Nome Schoolhouse

Originally built in 1916, the Nome Schoolhouse underwent a 3 year restoration bringing this historic building back to life. The restoration brought back many beautiful and historic features including windows, flooring, a large gymnasium, school rooms (which are now 11 bedrooms), plus new additions made to the building. The schoolhouse is now used as a Fiber Arts Retreat Center, event center, and boutique hotel. The schoolhouse puts on their own events and activities including Thirsty Thursdays and Nome for the Holidays, and it can also be rented for weddings or other larger gatherings. There are rooms available to stay in inside the schoolhouse, and campsites on the property allow for this space to be multi-functional.
