Rugby

The city has long considered itself the geographic center of North America. While that has recently come up for debate, there is no doubt that the north-central North Dakota town is a hub of activities and attractions.

[Geographic Center of North America Monument](#): The center is marked with a monument or cairn that is pyramid form in shape. It is 21 feet high, 6 feet wide at its base, and setting on a heart shaped foundation.

[Northern Lights Tower](#): Monument honoring the Aurora Borealis, which dance through the night skies.

Minot

Line up your lodging for the night, then tour the city. Campground options:

[Roughrider Campground](#): Quiet, secluded, woody area near town with 80 sites, dump station, shower, laundry, playground, fire pits, Wi-Fi.

[Swenson RV/KOA](#): 135 Sites with full hook-ups, on-site service techs, community room, coin laundry, bathrooms and showers, Wi-Fi.

Don't miss these gems:

[Scandinavian Heritage Park](#): Replicas are found here from each of the five Scandinavian countries: Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland and Iceland. See a real grass-roof Stabbur, a replica Stave Church from Gol, Norway, and a 25-foot-tall Swedish Dala horse.

[Dakota Territory Air Museum](#): Founded in June of 1986 with the incorporators' dream and desire to provide the most comprehensive aviation facility in the state and region.
