Day 5 — Bismarck-Mandan Area

North Dakota Heritage Center and State Museum:

The state's largest museum has an outstanding collection of Plains Indian artifacts and interpretive exhibits that feature North Dakota's varied American Indian, military and agricultural history and prehistory. Four galleries of artifacts and specimens, high-tech displays and interactive exhibits. Museum store, life-size T. rex skeleton, James River Café on site.

Lewis and Clark Riverboat: A 100-foot paddle-wheeler featuring twin decks and a 70-foot cabin that can carry more than 150 people on the Missouri River. Reopening in spring of 2021.

Chief Looking's Village: On the bluff overlooking the Lewis and Clark Riverboat, this Native American site has a self-guided tour of the grounds, earthlodge depressions and a fortification ditch. Great overview of the Missouri River between Bismarck and Mandan.

<u>Dakota Zoo:</u> Home to more than 600 animals, including 125 species, the zoo has a large variety of animals ranging from alligators to moose to mountain lions.

North Dakota Capitol: The 19-story, Art Deco building was constructed in 1933 for \$2 million and contains unique woods and materials from many states and countries.
