MUST SEE BEST PLACES

- **The Ralph:** Many have called Ralph Engelstad Arena the finest hockey facility in the world. Take a tour and see this gem on the prairie for yourself. Grand Forks (701) 777-4167
- **Pembina Gorge State Recreation Area:** A top destination for adventure seekers with 2,800 acres of public land and over 30 miles of mixed-use trails. Walhalla (701) 549-2444

- **One Majestic Place:** Cabin and gathering place overlooking the majestic Red River Valley.

IF TIME ALLOWS

- **Icelandic State Park:** Located on the shores of Lake Renwick, outdoor recreation is enhanced with the history of North Dakota's homesteading spirit, detailed at the Pioneer Heritage Center. Cavalier (701) 265-4561
- **Turtle River State Park:** Year-round recreational activities in a beautiful, wooded valley along the meandering Turtle River. Arvilla (701) 795-3180
- **University of North Dakota, John D. Odegard School of Aerospace Sciences:** Call ahead for guided tours featuring flight simulators, air traffic control labs and an altitude chamber. Grand Forks (701) 777-3180
- **Pembina State Museum:** Details the history of the fur trade era as well as the histories of the Ojibwa, Dakota, Assiniboine, Cree and Métis peoples. The observation tower offers a 360° view of the Red River Valley area. Pembina (701) 825-6840
- **Gingras Trading Post State Historic Site:** Features the oldest standing building structures in state, originally constructed by Métis fur trader Antoine Gingras. Pembina (701) 825-6840
