

HIGHWAY 281 – from the International Peace Garden through the Prairie Pothole Region

Dunseith

• **INTERNATIONAL PEACE GARDEN:** Dedicated to peace between nations, the garden in the heart of the Turtle Mountains straddles the United States and Canada border. Home to international music and athletic camps, its many gardens and conservatory are open year-round.

Bottineau

- **MYSTICAL HORIZONS:** "Stonehenge of the prairie" features stone and cement structures designed to view solstices and the equinox and offers a breathtaking view.
- **PRIDE DAIRY:** Serves up homemade cheeses, syrups, caramels and ice cream, including the popular Juneberry flavor and Thomas Jefferson's signature vanilla ice cream.
- **TURTLE MOUNTAIN SCENIC BYWAY:** Enjoy a drive along the byway through the wooded landscape and tree-lined lakes unique to this part of North Dakota.

Belcourt

- **TURTLE MOUNTAIN CHIPPEWA HERITAGE CENTER:** Showcases the history and culture of the Turtle Mountain Band of Chippewa people.
- SKY DANCER CASINO & RESORT: Full-service casino located adjacent to the heritage center offers concerts and traditional music.

Cando

• **LAKE ALICE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE:** A major waterfowl concentration point during spring and fall migrations and breeding ground for thousands of ducks and geese.

Devils Lake

Devils Lake is one of the best fisheries in the world and a four-season playground where ice fishing is as famous as dropping a line on a summer day. Looking for a spot on the lake? Woodland Resort on Creel Bay, Spirit Lake Casino on the east end or Grahams Island on the west side offer all levels of accommodation snd entertainment while on the Lake.

- WHITE HORSE HILL NATIONAL GAME PRESERVE: The woodland habitat has great nature trails and is home to a large variety of wildlife, including bison, elk and migratory birds.
- **FORT TOTTEN STATE HISTORIC SITE:** This site has been everything from an active military post to a boarding school for Native American children. Now houses a bed and breakfast and summer musical theater.

New Rockford

• **THE OPERA HOUSE:** The Dakota Prairie Regional Center for the Arts presents seasonal productions in a restored theater.

Carrington

• **DAKOTA SUN GARDENS AND WINERY:** Beautiful gardens, tasting room and wine made from local and regional fruits.

Pingree

• **ARROWWOOD NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE:** A birder's paradise where more than 300 species of birds can be seen, including downy woodpeckers, greater yellowlegs and belted kingfishers.

Jamestown

- **WORLD'S LARGEST BUFFALO:** Had bison been this large (26 feet tall), they might still be roaming in great herds.
- **NATIONAL BUFFALO MUSEUM:** Dedicated to telling the story of the great herds of bison that once roamed the surrounding prairie. See a live buffalo herd. The Frontier Village and the World's Largest Buffalo statue are nearby.

Edgeley

• WHITESTONE HILL BATTLEFIELD: Monument site of the fiercest clash between U.S. Army soldiers and Native American tribes in what is now North Dakota.
