Westhope

- **MOJO ROAST:** Wake up with a cup of specialty coffee from this unique roaster.

Minot

Minot is a touch of Scandinavia right here in North Dakota. Home to the annual Norsk Høstfest in September as well as the Scandinavian Heritage Park. Downtown Minot features unique art communities like Artsplace and 62 Doors that are transforming downtown Minot with a collection of galleries, studios and lofts. For more art and dining, stop at 10 North Main, a true French steakhouse restaurant featuring local artists, including Walter Piehl.

- **SCANDINAVIAN HERITAGE PARK:** Stav Church and Stabbur, Dala Horse, Finnish sauna and a Danish windmill along with statues of Casper Oimoen, Leif Eiriksson and Hans Christian Anderson pay tribute to the area's Scandinavian heritage at the Scandinavian Heritage Park.
- **ROOSEVELT PARK ZOO:** North Dakota's largest zoo showcases tigers, bears, giraffes, zebras, kangaroos and more.

Garrison

Garrison is the north shore gateway to Lake Sakakawea, the state's largest lake and a year-round recreation destination. When you're played and shopped out, step into Four Seasons Restaurant for some homemade food or Ye Olde Malt Shoppe for a scoop or two of ice cream.

- **FORT STEVENSON STATE PARK:** Two marinas, hiking trails and a visitor center museum await visitors at the park overlooking Lake Sakakawea.
- **WALLY THE WALLEYE:** 26-foot-long statue on the north end of Main Street that proclaims Garrison as the Walleye Capital of the World. In the winter, he oversees activities during the Dickens Village Festival, a three-weekend Christmas-themed event in late November and mid-December.

Cole Harbor

- **LAKE AUDUBON NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE:** The eight-mile gravel route begins near the visitor center and winds along the scenic south shoreline of Lake Audubon. Highlights include views of Lake Audubon, prairie wetlands and grasslands and opportunities to observe many species of birds, other animals and plants. Visitors are welcome to leave their vehicle and stroll through the prairie or along the wind-blown shoreline of Lake Audubon.

Pick City

- **LAKE SAKAKAWEA STATE PARK:** A perfect place to swim, boat, hike or camp. Lake Sakakawea is one of the three largest man-made lakes in the country.
- **GARRISON DAM POWERPLANT:** Tour the facility to learn about the amount of power created in the plant with water from Lake Sakakawea.

Stanton

- **KNIFE RIVER INDIAN VILLAGES NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE:** Site of the Native American village that was home to Sakakawea, Lewis and Clark's guide on their journey west.

Washburn

- **LEWIS AND CLARK INTERPRETIVE CENTER/FORT MANDAN:** Visit the museum and the reconstructed fort where the Corps of Discovery spent more time than anywhere else on their journey.

Bismarck/Mandan

The Bismarck-Mandan area has welcomed visitors since Lewis and Clark paddled up the Missouri River in 1804.

- **THE NORTH DAKOTA HERITAGE CENTER AND STATE MUSEUM:** North Dakota's largest museum with four galleries tracing the state's rich history from its earliest geologic formation 600 million years ago to today.
- **FORT ABRAHAM LINCOLN STATE PARK:** Oldest state park offers an abundance of outdoor recreation surrounded by rich history. On-A-Slant Village features reconstructed Mandan Indian earthlodges. Fort McKeen military blockhouses overlook the Missouri River Valley. Tour Lt. Col. Custer's last military home and other fort structures.
- **THE NORTH DAKOTA CAPITOL GROUNDS:** Walk the Rough Rider Hall of Fame and take a guided or self-guided tour of the headquarters for state government. Features an observation area on the 18th floor. The grounds house the State Library, Veterans' Memorial, Arboretum a variety of statues and more.
- **LEWIS AND CLARK RIVERBOAT:** The explorers never had it so easy. Take in the sites while relaxing on this Missouri riverboat cruise.
- **HAWKTREE GOLF CLUB:** Bismarck's nationally recognized course that contours to the rolling hills near the Missouri River.
- **DAKOTA ZOO:** Most of the animals are the kinds Lewis and Clark wrote about in their journals. Stare down a mountain lion or a grizzly bear or visit the tigers and snow leopards!

HAGUE, STRASBURG AND LINTON AREA

Settled by Germans from Russia, each community holds the distinct honor of its attractions listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Linton's The Grill serves up authentic German food. *Setz dich und iss.* (Sit down and eat). A Touch of Honey®, a bee-keeping family, offers honey in a variety of forms, including liquid, creamy and in lip balms, lotions and shower gels.

- **HAGUE'S ST. MARY'S CATHOLIC CHURCH:** Features colorful and crafted stained glass. The adjacent cemetery displays ornate iron crosses.
- **STRASBURG'S WELK FARMSTEAD:** Boyhood home of "Champagne Music Maker" and big band leader Lawrence Welk.



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
